All of our students have access to a broad and balanced curriculum. Each day consists of 5 lessons, each 1 hour long. Alongside the core subjects of English, Maths and Science, students in Year 7 and 8 also study: Art, Music, Drama, Ethics, History, Geography, Modern Languages, Computing, Technologies and PE/Dance.

At the end of Year 8, students are able to choose the subjects they wish to study from Year 9 onwards, from a range of courses, and study their chosen GCSE, or equivalent, subjects for 3 years. All of our students have access to an extensive enrichment programme to support their learning and develop

their interests outside the classroom.

Our well-resourced Special Educational Needs & Disabilities (SEND) Department, has specially trained staff to support our youngsters with an identified need. The SEND team regularly collaborate with parents and other support agencies to create a bespoke programme to meet the needs of the individual. Parents who have a child with an Education Health Care Plan and require additional information, are welcome to contact our SENDCo directly.

We have the expertise to stretch and challenge our more able students both in class and through workshops, from the moment they enter the school. Special events are organised in conjunction with our

partners and other schools throughout the area to develop confidence and the resilience to consider opportunities, including pathways to top universities and aspirational careers.

Our Sixth Form offers a wide range of courses, collaborating with other local schools and the University of Essex. The well-established VI6 Partnership allows our students access to a wider range of A Level subjects, delivered on campus, by experienced members of staff providing them with a flavour of university life.

Pastoral Care

At times, throughout our lives we recognise that on occasions we will need extra care or support and someone to provide a listening ear. Kindness is intrinsic in everything we do at The Colne. We have established a very caring pastoral team, including non-teaching Year Managers, who are always available to listen to concerns and resolve any difficulties quickly and effectively.



Staff at The Colne are totally dedicated and committed to ensuring that all of our students receive a first class education.

This, combined with our facilities and resources, means that lessons are required to be both stimulating and creative. Homework is seen as an integral part of students' studies.

It is used to consolidate or extend topics covered in lessons. This helps to prepare students with the independent learning skills and techniques necessary for examinations Stage 4. at GCSE and beyond.

We have high expectations and through our teaching, we aim to challenge our students to think hard. A range of teaching styles is used, so that all students are stretched and

motivated to achieve their potential. Setting is introduced in some subjects as students move through Key Stage 3 and on to Key

Education is a continuum and we want to ensure that all of our students are equipped with the knowledge and skills they need to become life-long learners and access aspirational career pathways.





To complement our curriculum there are a range of extra-curricular activities.

There is something for everyone and all students are encouraged to participate whether their interests are in sports, the arts, STEM, community and charity work. Such opportunities help broaden horizons and develop a sense of community.

Sport at The Colne is high profile and mainstream sports such as football, rugby and netball are popular with both boys and girls. Outside of this students are encouraged to try new and exciting sports such as climbing, handball and trampoline. Our sports facilities are excellent with full-sized rugby and football pitches, an all-weather pitch, a fitness suite, tennis and netball courts, climbing wall plus a fully equipped state-of-the-art sports hall; there is something for all sports enthusiasts to enjoy.

Our art and performance subjects are highly regarded with regular exhibitions and performances to showcase our students' talents.

Our staff are very giving of their time and consequently the opportunities available to our students are staggering whether that be ski trips, water sports trips or the American Exchange to name just a few.
